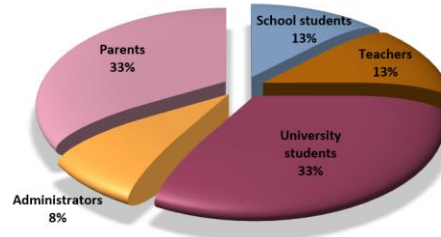

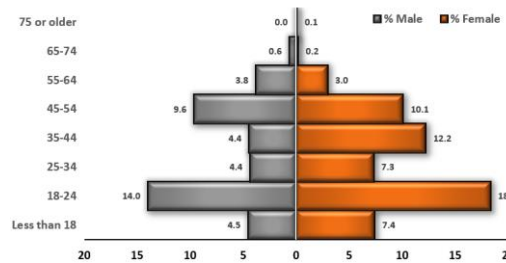

Survey Respondents by Age and Gender

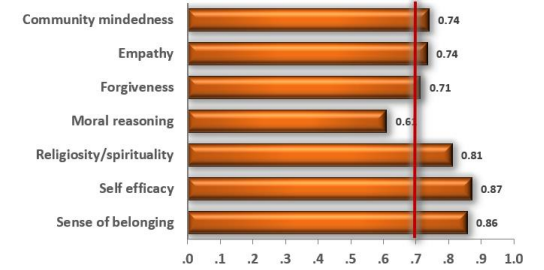


Surveyed Students by School Year

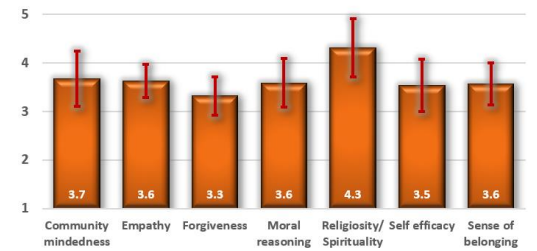
